Client Rights

Please Note**

These client rights are set by the State of New Jersey for **ALL** mental health providers. Except for number 5, these rights are applicable to in-patient treatment rather than to Main St. Counseling Center's outpatient setting.

- 1. The right to be free from unnecessary or excessive medication.
- 2. The right to not be subjected to non-standard treatment or procedures, experimental procedures or research, psycho-surgery, sterilization, electro-convulsive therapy or provider demonstration programs, without written informed consent, after consultation with counsel or interested party of the client's choice.

*If a client has been adjudicated incompetent, authorization for such procedure may be obtained only pursuant to the requirements on N.J.S.A. 30:4-24.2d(2).

- 3. The right to treatment in the least restrictive setting, free from physical restraints and isolation, provided, however, that a client in Inpatient Care maybe restrained or isolated in an emergency pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 30:4-24.2d(3)
- 4. The right to be free from corporal punishment.
- 5. The right to privacy and dignity.
- 6. The right to the least restrictive conditions necessary to achieve the goals of treatment and service.
